Geriatric Oncology: Educating Nurses to Improve Quality Care

This NCI-funded national project is a two and a half day program for oncology nurses to increase their knowledge of caring for older adults with cancer.

PROGRAM COMPONENTS:

- Comprehensive interactive geriatric oncology curriculum for nurses with a multidisciplinary faculty.
- Program moves beyond lecture format by focusing on applying the information to your practice setting and developing a plan to implement geriatric oncology tactics at your home institution.
- Each organization that chooses to participate will **send a team** to the conference consisting of:
 - Nurse manager (who manages other nurses at the institution)
 - Nurse educator (whose primary role is education at the institution)
 - Direct patient care nurse (RN or NP who provides direct patient care)

- Oncology RN teams interested in developing geriatric oncology programs for their home institutions.
